Year 4 Stationery Requirements for 2024

Your child needs to bring the stationery and requirements **only once** per year. Please send these items to school with your child on the first day of school. Should any items be used up or lost during the school year, especially books for writing in and pencils etc, you will be asked to supply more. Your child will sit with a teacher and go through the items they brought to check if it is all there and to ensure the necessary items are marked sufficiently.

Children who care for and use items sparingly will have left over items that may be re-used or filled up the next year (personal items will be returned at the end of every school year).

Children who look after their items and use it sparingly will have **leftovers to use the next year.**

School bag

Please ensure that your child's bag fits into the school's cubby holes and no wheelie bags. The measurements are:
Height: 46 cm **Width:** 29 cm **Depth:** 28 cm

Workbooks and writing books

In Primary School the children may cover their writing books with coloured paper, nature pictures or other decorations – many enjoy adding a personal touch or artwork. **No cartoon, action or TV/movie characters or people please.** Then cover in clear plastic making sure the sides are taped nicely for heavy handling and use. Your child's name and the subject on a label on the front (make sure it is the front by checking that the margin is on the left when you open the book). Afrikaans and Zulu workbooks need to have your child's name written neatly on the front and then covered with clear plastic.

Personal Stationery

Your child will use and be responsible for their own pencil bag and the items in it. Please ensure that these items are very clearly and permanently marked. Permanent marker rubs off eventually and is therefore not sufficient. Writing your child's name on small strips of paper and then taping these name strips with cellotape around or onto the item is a more permanent solution. One can also purchase name label stickers for clothes and stationery from various online suppliers. Please ensure that you get the correct wrap around labels for pencils.

Clothing items

Please mark all clothing items clearly and permanently. Permanent and laundry markers wash off eventually. All children have the same or very similar items, and your child will not be able to find their own items if the items are not clearly marked. The lost property basket is emptied at the end of each term and unmarked clothes added to the school's second-hand donations. Please note that it is not the teacher's responsibility to find misplaced personal belongings, but your child's.

General stationery and requirements

These form part of the communal supply and will be shared by all; therefore these items do not need to be clearly marked.

Should you fail to supply the above in the first week of school, the school will purchase the items on your behalf and charge it to your school fee account, to be paid before issued
